Objectives

Here, we establish "Asian Consortium of Volcanology (ACV)" for the promotion in volcanology in Asian countries/regions through the collaboration between volcanologists and authorities. The members will cooperate in one or more missions below.

1. Sharing the scientific and technological knowledges in volcanology.
2. Sharing the experiences of volcanic disaster and strategies of hazard mitigation.
3. Encouraging young volcanologists through the scientific lectures, trainings and projects.
4. Promotion collaboration with the international projects and databases.
5. Annual field camps.

Participation

ACV has core-member organizations (CMO) in each Asian country and its corresponding member. The core-member meeting (CMM) is composed of these core-member organizations and discusses on the operation of ACV, including the selection of president and secretary general, collaborative investigation projects, field camp plans, information dissemination and financial plans.

Each core-member organization will inform the ACV activity to its local volcanological community and call for the participation.

Those which countries have no core-member organizations will make contacts to the core-member-organization, and the core-member meeting will authorize the participation.






